Contraceptive Coverage

A range of voluntary family planning services is available to FEHB members at no cost:

- Surgically implanted contraceptives
- Injectable contraceptive drugs (such as Depo Provera)
- Intrauterine devices (IUDs)
- Diaphragms
- Tubal ligation
- Cervical caps
- Contraceptive drugs and devices as listed in the Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) website.
- Emergency contraceptives, covered at no cost to the member if prescribed by a physician and purchased at a network pharmacy.

Clinician-administered contraceptives are covered under the medical benefit. Oral and self-administered contraceptives are covered under the prescription drug benefit.

Exceptions

Non-formulary branded contraceptives can be requested without cost-sharing through the <u>exception process</u>. These will be covered without cost sharing if used for contraception and also if deemed medically necessary. The provider should indicate "urgent/expedited" and for "copay waiver review" on the request.

Reimbursement for **over-the-counter contraceptives** can be submitted by utilizing the <u>direct medical reimbursement claim process</u> if a valid prescription is first obtained from a prescriber to provide coverage.

For **expedited exceptions**, providers should indicate on the <u>prior authorization</u> submission that the request is "urgent/expedited" and for "copay waiver review." Additional information may be found on page 21 of the <u>2025 Plan Brochure</u>.
